I/We acknowledge that under the *Life Insurance Act 1995* OnePath is required, where the net claim value of the policy is \$25,000 or more, to advertise in a newspaper its intention of issuing a replacement policy and that **a waiting period of 10 working days must elapse from the date of advertising before OnePath may issue a replacement document.**
6. I/We acknowledge that under the *Life Insurance Act 1995* I/we must meet the expenses of the advertisement and replacement of the policy document and I/we agreed to do so in the amount listed above.
7. I/We consent to the collection, use, storage and disclosure of my/our personal information as described in the Privacy Policy and the Privacy Statement contained in the PDS (including discussing any information obtained from me/us and any doctors or accountants with the financial adviser associated with this application). **Note 1** A person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence, the punishment for which is imprisonment for a term of 4 years – see section 11 of the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*.

**Note 2** Chapter 2 of the Criminal Code applies to all offences against the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959* – see section 5A of the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*.
